The Village always needed a great Jersey diner, and now you can have one.

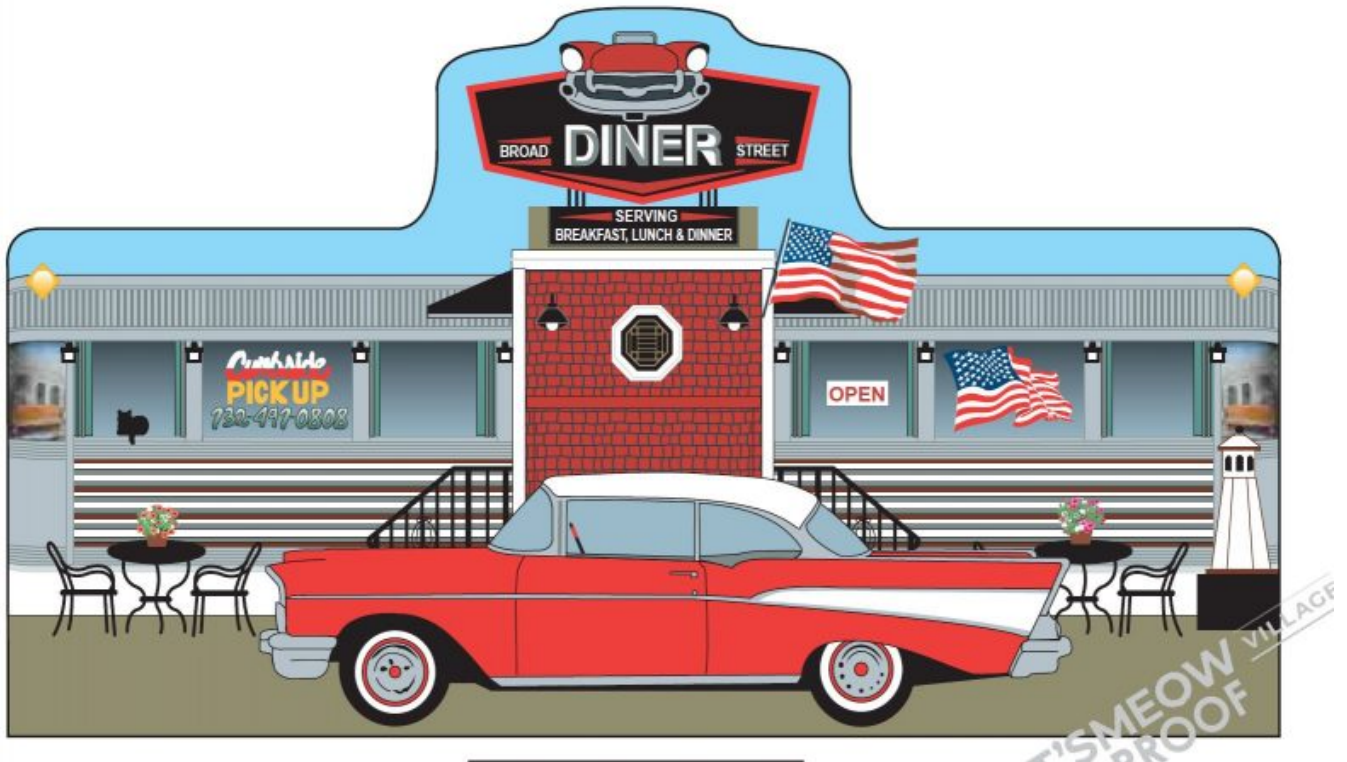

New Jersey's diner history began July 3, 1912, the Jerry O'Mahony Diner opened near Jersey City, New Jersey while his diner manufacturing business in Elizabeth made over 2000 mobile eateries from 1917 to 1952 that fed hungry Americans from coast to coast.

The silver railcar style and neon signs of the classic American diner still brighten New Jersey's highways and Main Streets. Everyone has a favorite diner and a favorite diner story. Whether it's a Happy Waitress Special, Cheeseburger Platter, or a three egg omelet with regular coffee, Jerseyans know they are in the state's ultimate happy place. And the "daily special" gives something for everyone for any moment, high school students, retirees, construction workers and crossing guards might be found at a counter chatting with the waitresses and line cooks. Or you take a booth and engage the table jukebox, Jerseyans yearn for lost favorites like the Excellent, Lido or Rosie's Diner and still gather at the beloved Bendix, Tick Tock, OB, Summit, Park West and yes the **Broad Street Diner in Keyport, voted New Jersey's Most Iconic Diner.**

This authentic circa 1953 O'Mahony diner is just a few blocks from Raritan Bay. Known previously as Stanley's



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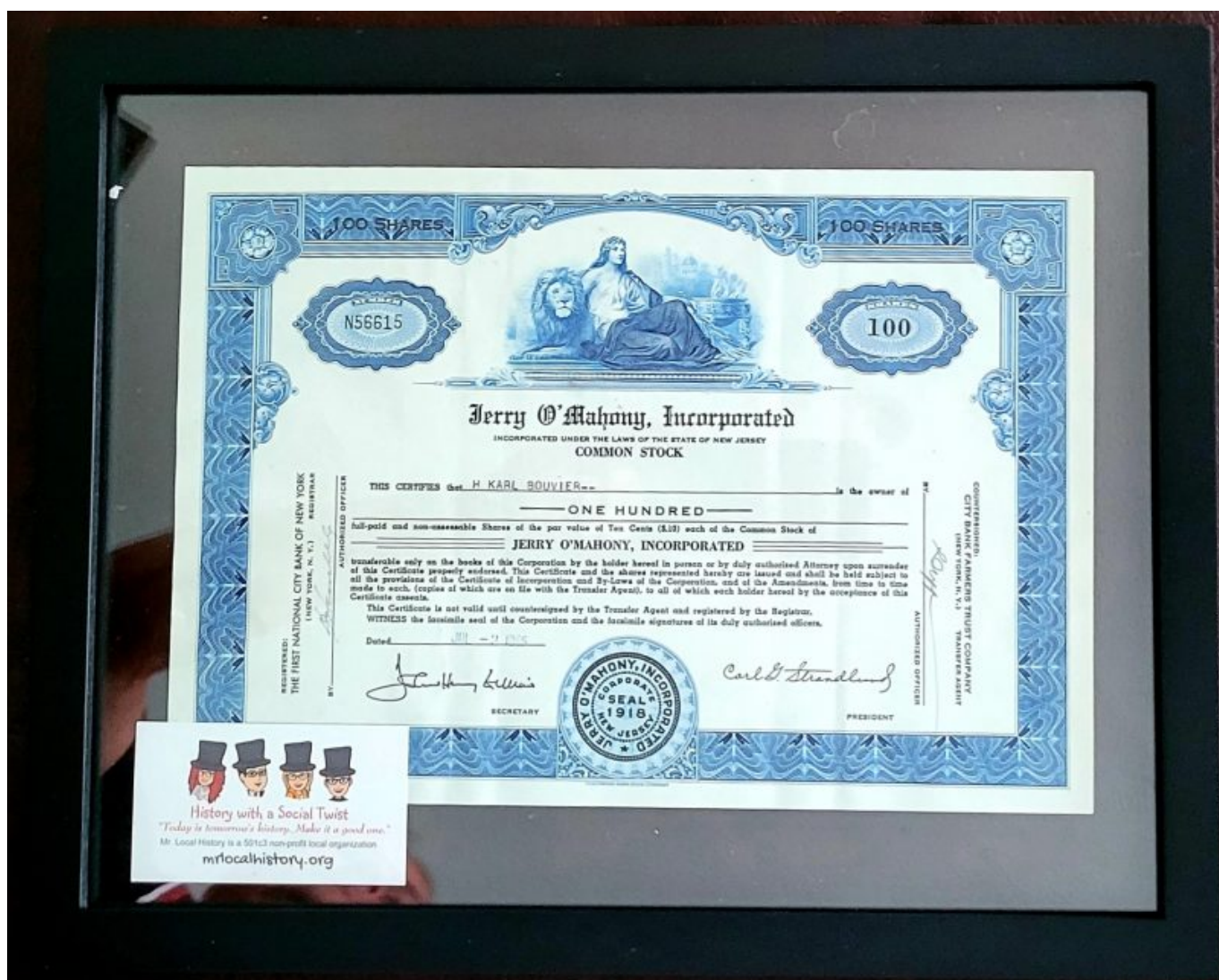
Seaport Diner, you won't have to wonder much about its 1950s origins as you will be reminded at every turn that this place has been around since Elvis and Marilyn. The O'Mahony stainless steel tag is attached to the inside of the vestibule door. Broad Street is one of a handful of classic O'Mahony diners still operating in the Garden State.

That's where you'll meet, greet, and mingle with the staff and customers.
